- 2. The Judge(s) may at their discretion withhold any award in any class where they consider the standard of the exhibits of insufficient merit.
- 3. The Society's Trophies, Medals and Diplomas will be awarded as indicated in this Schedule.
- 4. The Classification of the plants shall for the purpose of the show be that given in the "Handbook of Shows", 10th Edition.
- 5. Judging will be under the BCSS Rules and Recommendations as laid down in the "Handbook of Shows", 10th Edition. The decision of the Judge shall be final.
- 6. Complaints must be made in writing to the Show Secretary before 14:30 on the day of the Show.
- 7. All classes require one plant only except where otherwise stated
- 8. The pot size shall be taken as the inside measurement at the top-diameter for round pots and the distance between opposite sides for square pots.
- 9. Entries must be staged by 10:00 on the day of the Show.
- 10. Plants exhibited must be the property of the entrant(s).
- 11. Exhibitors must not remove plants from the Show Hall before 16:00 on the day of the Show.
- 12. The Show Committee cannot accept liability for the loss of, or damage to, plants or other personal property, nor for bodily injury incurred by persons while attending the Show however caused.
- 13. Staging will be supervised by the Show Convenor and Stewards, who alone will have the right to move or alter any exhibit.
- 14. Points: 1st Prize 3 points; 2nd Prize 2 points; 3rd Prize 1 point.
- 15. Exhibitors may exhibit any number of entries in any class.
- 16. Exhibitors MUST report to the Show Convenor to be allocated their Exhibitor's Number and staging cards BEFORE STAGING THEIR PLANTS.
